MINUTES: Regular Monthly Meeting Chester County Agricultural Development Council Hybrid Meeting Government Services Center Room 270

September 6, 2023

CALL TO ORDER:

The regular meeting of the Agriculture Development Council held in person at the Government Services Center Suite 270 and via Zoom audio/video on Wednesday, September 6, 2023 was called to order at 9:31. A.M. by Vice Chair Dr. Barbara Dallap-Schaer.

ACTION ITEMS:

A MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES FOR THE MAY 3, 2023 MEETING OF THE AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL WAS MADE BY MR. POMPO, SECONDED BY MR. HEENAN, AND WAS PASSED BY UNANIMOUS VOTE OF THE COUNCIL.

DISCUSSION AND INFORMATION ITEMS:

Ag Plan Implementation:

Ms. Griffith reported that as part of CCPC's work program, the Sustainability division will work with Ms. Lane to help implement the Ag Economic Development Plan by assembling steering committee/focus groups of agricultural representatives to identify needs for sustainability reporting and enhancing sustainable practices for increasing product marketability and competitiveness. Ms. Griffith provided the board with a proposed scope of work for the support for environmental sustainability enhancements in Chester County agricultural businesses.

Mr. Walschburger reported that the county is still working on how to best support the agricultural community outreach efforts. Mr. Walschburger can give an update at the next ADC board meeting.

Mr. Fritz reported on a proposal of a farm suitability tool which is divided into four categories: land characteristics including prime farmland soils, existing cropland, existing preserved land, and environmental constraints; municipal

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policies including ag-friendly zoning and ag security areas; parcel data including ChescoViews data; and economic context including county ag characteristics and farm product guide data. Mr. Ferris suggested adding average rainfall data and Mr. Westlake suggested adding growing degree days data. Mr. Ferris also mentioned that CCPC should look at a tool at beescape.org that has similar data.

Ms. Gauker is working full time with Penn State Extension but will again be facilitating the ag economic development plan through her part-time work with CCEDC through December. To get back on track after the summer hiatus, Ms. Gauker will be facilitating a meeting with partners (CCEDC, PSU Extension, Parks & Preservation, and ADC) to determine the implementation schedule for the plan. Ms. Gauker announced that Jordan Peek is CCEDC's new ag program manager. Engaging the private sector will help with the plan's successful implementation. A proposal will be created for adding grant writing back into the plan as per Ag Council board member request

Communication and Outreach:

Ms. Lane reported on the success of social media outreach over the summer months. The Farm Guide topic performed the best. Other successful posts this summer include the local farm map, the National Farmers Market week, and the Kimberton Fair awards. Ms. Lane tabled at and attended many events this summer including the Farm Tales program, Exton Day, Taste of the Farm, three Town Tours and Village Walks, lantern fly press conference, Kimberton Fair, America 250th, and hosted a Wellness activity for county staff. There are several events coming up including Good Food Fest, Lundale Fall Festival, and the Unionville County Fair. For all the events, CCPC graphics staff developed two youth coloring sheets, a QR coded map, seasonal product calendar, and a double-sided rack card combining bicycle & pedestrian safety with sharing the road with farmers.

Next, Ms. Lane reported that the updated Farm Guide has had great feedback on the new name and design, 14,000 copies were printed, and there were over 60 distribution points. Ms. Lane coordinated with Getaways on Display program to place The Chester County Farm Guide at all highways' welcome centers. Ms. Lane mentioned developing a new trifold brochure with just the map and pick-your-own farm listings.

AG Awards:

Ms. Lane reported that the Miller family is receiving the Farmers of the Year award and Dr. Kevin Hicks is receiving the Ag Service award. The awards program will be hosted at the Miller family farm on October 16. After the awards ceremony and farm tour, Ms. Lane plans to have a meeting with the Chester County Commissioners about how to help the agriculture industry succeed and prosper.

Municipal Update:

Mr. Fritz reported that the graphics team has created an internal dashboard of interactive maps highlighting the six agzoning outreach areas which include: objectives promote ag preservation, designated or specialized ag district, secondary farm business allowed, ag uses permitted by right, controlled environmental ag, and agritainment allowed. A summary map was also discussed which showed which 22 municipalities have been covered. Mr. Bruckno noted that most of the 22 municipalities are in the western part of the county. The next steps will include municipalities in the eastern part of the county. Mr. Ferris suggested adding protected open space designations to the outreach areas. Mr. Bruckno reported on a West Bradford amendment allowing an agricultural day camp as a farming accessary use where students can attend during the day to experience what farming is really like.

Ms. Stauffer reported on agricultural municipal ordinance resource guidance. CCPC has guidance in three areas including wineries, farmers' markets, and controlled environment ag. CCPC eTools provide subject area reviews, issues, implementing suggestions, successful examples, and links to other related resources. More information can be found on all CCPC eTools here: https://www.chescoplanning.org/MuniCorner/AllTools.cfm. The ag eTools page also includes links to an ag friendly municipality flyer and an ag in developed communities guide. Mr. Westlake suggested adding a link on the ADC website to the CCPC eTools webpage. Mr. Westlake also suggested adding a timber harvesting eTool and/or fact sheet. Mr. Ferris discussed bee keeping issues and current bee laws. Lastly, Ms. Stauffer showed the resources on the ADC website under the Farming Facts which include introduction to ag for municipal officials, ACRE info sheet, and a backyard poultry info sheet. Other farming fact info sheets on the ADC website include dairy, mushroom, equine, field crops, and the ag census. The ADC website can be found at https://www.chescofarming.org/


